



NOEMI'S NOTES

This month I'm going to talk a little bit about travel, since we have Estrella War coming up this month. In the SCA some level of travel is inevitable, so the question really is how far you would like to travel. When I first joined the SCA I traveled as much as my college student budget would allow. For something big like Estrella it sometimes meant scrimping and saving, but it was always worth it. I've fought in four Estrella Wars and wouldn't trade in those memories for anything. Now that I'm in the "real world" I try to travel to events as much as possible. I've even traveled to Atlantia to teach a class at an A&S Collegium. You don't have to go quite that far unless you want to, however I encourage everyone to travel as far and as much as you can. You will get to meet fascinating people and learn more about the SCA.

An interesting side effect to traveling are some of the interesting things you see on the way. I have seen huge metal teepees in Arizona, some of the most interesting tourist traps and really amazing signs along the side of the road. Going south from Flagstaff into Phoenix I saw a sign that stated "Ice may form on bridge first." A pretty standard sign, except that there were several bridges along the road after that sign, so I'm still not sure which bridge the ice would form on first. Also going south to Phoenix there is a sign to let you know that you are entering a national forest, not a tree a sight, but there is a large saguaro cactus right next to the sign. On sign I've seen several places is "Gusty winds may exist". Now my first though on seeing this was that it was awful nice of someone to give those gusty winds the right to exist. My second thought was that is was a rather philosophical sign. . .gusty winds may exist, but then again they may not.

My personal favorite sign, though, has nothing to do with strange phrasing, or circumstance. It has to do with how it sounds. On I-25 just north of Las Vegas, NM there is a sign for a turn off for Wattrous Valmora. Now, I know that it is merely a turn off for two small communities, however think for a moment how it sounds. Say it out loud and think about it. What does it sound like it should be to you? Mistress Aldyth thinks it sounds like a nasty disease. My husband thinks it sounds like a geologic formation, as in "We find the most stegosaurus remains near the Wattrous Valmora". I think it sounds like a rare animal, which may take a bit of set up to get the mental image. First, imagine a TV documentary safari leader sneaking through the underbrush, turning to the camera to say "Today we are stalking the rare Wattrous Valmora. We must be careful, since this shy creature can become violent if cornered."

Just remember to try to travel as much as possible and to travel as safely as possible. Keep an open mind and keep you eyes open since you never know what you'll see.

The Dust? Last year was a very dry & cold winter in Phoenix, which led to a very dusty site. With the huge population boom on site, an extra 1,200 attendees, and a "hard freeze" Tuesday evening just prior to opening, the ground cover (dormant Bermuda grass) quickly died and the

site became very barren. This coupled with the camp smoke from the attendees, led to dusty site.

This year the Kingdom of Atenveldt, the War Staff, and the Site Owner are working hard to ensure the survival of the ground cover on the main camping field. Winter grass is already planted, extra watering has been arranged, and multiple passes by the water trucks are all part of our efforts to decrease the dust. The grass is growing greener with each passing day, and the work crews have been working hard to improve the fighting areas within the Battle Pit! Driving on the interior roads will be limited to loading and unloading only.

Please be prepared - Most of us are city dwellers, going from our climate controlled homes, to our climate controlled vehicles to our climate controlled places of employment or colleges, suddenly thrust into a dirty, smoky environment with a few thousand friends from around the globe. Add to this the unpredictable weather, cold and windy, or dry and hot - It's Phoenix.

If you have a known respiratory history, or allergies, you are urged to contact your family physician prior to the event & bring with you whatever prescriptions or over-the-counter medications you may need in a varied environment. Please consider this a primitive site.

Minors All minors (17 years & younger) must be registered and have a site waiver on file. All minors will be issued an ID bracelet to be worn at all times. Children (7 years & younger) must be registered at Troll but will not be charged site fee. All minors attending the event must be accompanied by a parent or a legal guardian also attending the event. Proof of temporary guardianship IS required. You must have two copies of notarized documentation if you are bringing other minor children onto site with you OTHER THAN YOUR OWN CHILDREN. These papers must originate from your state of origin; one form to be kept at registration & the other with the child/guardian. If you arrive without documentation you will not be allowed onto the site.

The Estrella War Staff & the SCA are not responsible for providing this documentation NOR CAN THEY. This paperwork is the responsibility of the parents & guardian bringing the minor(s) onto the site. Our staff understands the legalities surrounding this issue & the responsibilities

Directions: From the North: Take I-17 south through Phoenix and east onto I-10, &c continue east onto the Superstition Freeway (State Route 60); Continue east to Ellsworth and turn south (right). Go south on Ellsworth to Rittenhouse Road, and turn southeast (casual left). Follow Rittenhouse southeast to Combs Road and make a left, this will lead you on into the Festival Site.

From the South: Take your best route to I-17 and state Route 60 (Superstition) and head east on 60 to Ellsworth. Make a right and head south down Ellsworth to Rittenhouse. Then as described above.

From the East: Head into Phoenix on State Route 60 going west to Ellsworth, and turn south (left), follow Ellsworth to Rittenhouse, then as above.

Or

From the East: Head into Phoenix on State Route 87 going south west into the valley, and turn south (left) onto Country Club Drive. Head east (left) onto State Route 60 to Ellsworth, then as above.

From the West: Head east into the valley on I-10 to east bound State 60 to South om Ellsworth and SE on Rittenhouse, then as above.

There will be signs marking each of these turns as you approach Ellsworth and Rittenhouse.

DA'UD BOB'S MOVIE REVIEW

Why is there always such a difference between an experience you'll always remember, and one that you'll never forget? Well, now, for years I've been able to use a stage production of *Shogun Macbeth* as an example of "Shakespeare gone bad, very bad". And it was. Images from that production are seared in my memory, and try as I might, I have been unable to rid myself of them. A samurai armored "Macbess" (Japanese doesn't have a "th" sound, to the best of my knowledge) skulking about a darkened set, witches in obis, katanas instead of broadswords. Burnham Wood had to travel a "fur piece" to arrive in shogunate Japan. Does that mean, however, that Shakespeare cannot be done well in a Japanese setting? (Well, some purists would argue that the question is merely rhetorical, or that it cannot truly be asked to begin with. The answer, to them, is obvious. "Of course not.") Akira Kurosawa, one of the world's foremost moviemakers, has attempted what many consider to be impossible, and done it very well. He did modify much of the language and all of the names, to make the setting in Japan more Japanese. Be that as it may, this month Da'ud Bob reviews what might have been called "King Lear Meets Shogun", but which was actually titled *Ran*.

Starring Tatsuya Nakadai as Hidetora Ichimonji, Akria Terao as Taro, Jinpachi Nezu as Jiro, Daisuke Ryu as Saburo, Mieko Harada as Kaede, and Peter as Kyoami the Fool, the story, for the three of you out there who have seen or read no Shakespeare, is: aging king decides to retire, and divides his lands among his three (in this case) sons, Taro, Jiro, and Saburo. Two think it's a good idea; the youngest doesn't and is disinherited. The two then pretty much take over, dictating to their father what he may do and how many attendants he may have, etc., etc. In the end, as in every good Shakespearean drama, everybody dies.

Good points (besides the fact that Kurosawa is the director, I mean): The location shots. The costuming. (This film won the 1985 Oscar for Best Costuming. Watch it and see why.) The horse tack and tassles. The armor and accouterments. The battle scenes. (But battle scenes are something that Kurosawa does extremely well.) The beheading. (_Must_ be seen to be appreciated.) That Kaede is one tough woman.

Bad points: Too much blood. (I think they must have been having a sale on red paint.)

Zero breasts. 16 gallons of blood. 169 dead bodies. Arm rolls. Plots (and counter-plots) roll. Horsemen roll. Arrows break. Blood spurts. Arrow fu. Musket fu. Flute fu. Severed arm fu. Gratuitous boar hunt. Gratuitous sealing pact with blood. Gratuitous moth squishing. Gratuitous story with moral. Academy Award nominations to Peter as Kyoami the Fool, one of the wisest, and most loyal, characters in the film; and to Tatsuya Nakadai as /K/i/n/g//L/e/a/r/ Hidetora, calling his son more than henpecked (Anna Sue's term was a fair bit stronger, but not really repeatable in a "family friendly" newsletter), for "The hen pecks the cock and makes him crow." An 88 on the Vomit Meter. Three Stars. Da'ud Bob says "Check it out!"
