## Thorrablót Customs

The word "Thorrablót" was first used in the Middle Ages when old King Thorri, who was a great one for sacrifices, made one every year in the middle of winter. According to an old Icelandic calendar, there were only two seasons, winter and summer. Time was measured by counting the weeks of each season. Thorri is the fourth Old Norse winter month, which begins on Friday of the 13th week of winter. This year it falls on February 3rd.

Jon Arnason's "Icelandic Folk and Fairy Tales" describes it as "the duty of the farmer to welcome Thorri" by rising earlier than anyone on the farm the first morning. He was to rise and go outside only in a shirt, barefoot, and partly barelegged. He was to hop on one foot around the farmhouse, still dragging his pants on the other foot and bid Thorri welcome to his home. In some places in northern Iceland the first day of Thorri is called "husbands day" and the men are supposed to be treated well by their spouses.

When Christianity was adopted, sacrifices to heathen spirits were prohibited, and since there were plenty of major ecclesiastical festivities around this time, thorrablót was almost forgotten. However Thorrablót was rekindled by Icelandic students in 1873. It took about 90 years before the custom spread throughout Iceland. At that time also, the word "Thorrafood" began to be seen in print. Actually, Thorrafood is just traditional Icelandic dishes prepared the way people were forced to do it in earlier times, when necessity and primitive methods of preservation demanded total utilization of their livestock. Food was smoked, salted, dried, pickled or fermented. Thus, what once was a manifestation of dire need has now become a delicacy.

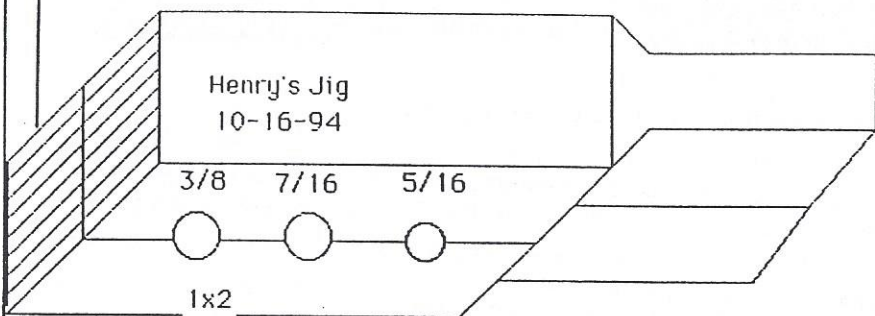
The principle kinds of Thorrafood are the following:

HANGIKET (hung meat) which is smoked lamb or mutton.  
HVALRENGI-pickled whale blubber.  
HAKARL-fermented shark meat which has ripened by burial for a certain length of time to make it decompose.  
SVID-roasted sheep head. The sheep heads are burnt with a torch to burn the wool off. They are then sawed in half, washed and boiled in water. The sheep heads are served with mashed potatoes and mashed turnips.  
SVIDASULTA-the meat from the sheep head used to make headcheese.  
HRUTSPUNGAR-soured (pickled) rams' testicles  
LUNDABAGGAR-(loin bags) which are sausages made from the neck tissue wrapped in the colon, sewed shut and boiled.  
BLODMOR-blood pudding. Blood from a lamb which is taken and mixed with animal fat.  
LIFRAPILSA- liver sausage. Liver is ground two or three times in an ordinary meat grinder. Then it is mixed with animal fat and rye-meal. This mixture is stuffed into sheep stomachs and then boiled. The sausages can also be boiled, let cook, and then sliced and fried in a pan served with sugar on top.  
HARDFISKUR-dried fish, ysa. We call this fish haddock  
FLATKOKUR-flat bread  
RUGBRAUD-rye bread

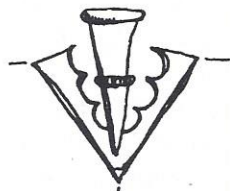
Pickling the Icelandic way is with lactic acid obtained from sour milk or whey.

The experience of tasting these foods is one I will never forget and I promise I will not have a Thorrablót Event because I don't know where I could find these food delicacies in our entire region.

3 record set music anthology. Available at public  
library in Cheyenne, Wyoming. Text of music missing.

In my opinion, this three record set is quite a gem. It has some scratches and skips from being used. But that doesn't hinder the spirit or emotion. All songs have titles, acknowledgement of composers (if they are known), and a list of instruments played. Since I obtained this anthology on loan from the library, I invite all to have the opportunity of checking it out. And listen to the transition of history. Although the text is missing, there are some famous composers on the anthology. This includes King Henry VIII, Guillaume de Machaut, John Dunstable, Dufay, King Richard the lion hearted (Richard I of England), and Adam de Halle. Also other known composers, as well as anonymous composers. The singing is a little monotonous and the tempo from some of the music is very slow. Aside from that, this anthology is beautiful and well worth a try.

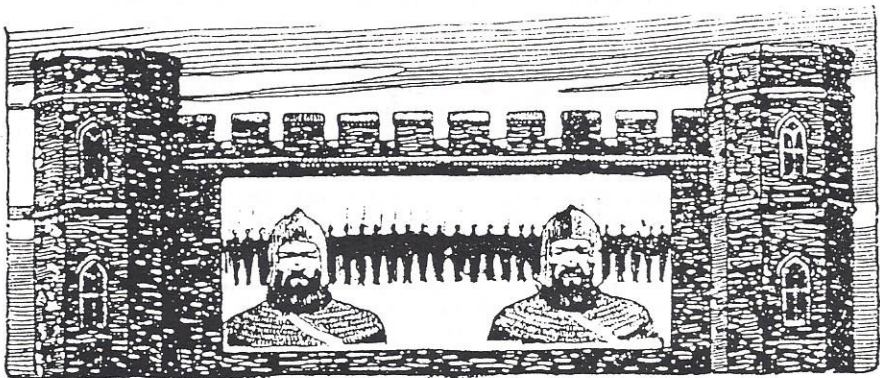

This year the Armies and Artisans of Atenveldt shall meet their brothers from the Outlands upon the fields of Estrella. The noble Armies of Caid shall be attending to balance the sides as the Outlands had done the previous year. We invite the Knowne Worlde to attend and enjoy six days of Fighting, Arts, Camaraderie, Revelry and Shopping!

This year we have expanded the site with a larger and more accessible Merchants Row (set in a new portion of the Park, east of the Fighting Field.) To the south of Merchants Row (in the tree grove) we have reserved a large space for "Enchanted Ground." Everyone who wishes to take part in this area is cordially invited to attend.

With the moving of Merchants Row to a more spacious area, we now have a great deal more camping space. The eastern camping area of the park will be "Sleepy Hollow" for all you early risers. The rest of the Park is there for your enjoyment as normal. The park has improved the shoulders of the road to allow "head in" parking instead of parallel. Huzzah! This should relieve a great deal of the parking headaches.

If you wish to rent a pavilion, please contact Tri-Rentals, (602) 966-3474. This is not the same tent company as last year and we believe that this will resolve many of the difficulties we've experienced in the past (the autocrats are NOT responsible for any hassles that may occur as a result of using a mundane vendor!) Ask for Estrella War information or Mr. Ed Ayo (they have literature in the information packet, see listing below) as they have special pricing and packages just for us at volume discount levels.

As usual, weather is unpredictable in the Great Southern Desert. Be prepared for anything from hot days, to cold nights, to rain and wind. All flames must be enclosed in a container; fire-pits, lanterns and enclosed torches are fine--open candles and unscreened tiki torches are not. Please bring a fire extinguisher for each tent by order of the City of Goodyear Fire Marshal. All minors not accompanied by their parent must have a NOTARIZED Minor's Waiver and Medical Waiver (your Seneschal should have these.)

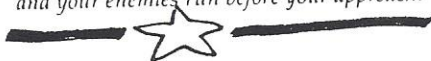
Once again, there are NO accommodations for horses. Please don't bring them. That's the park's ruling, not ours--they will not be allowed into the park. All pets must be kept on leashes, or secured in your camp. There will be no pets allowed in the food areas of Merchants Row. Animals found running loose will be turned over by the Park Rangers to local animal control officers.

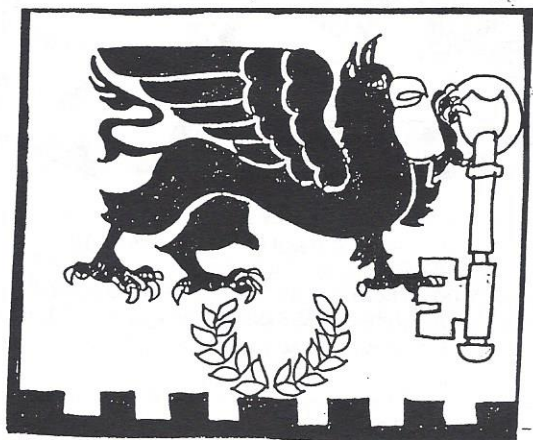

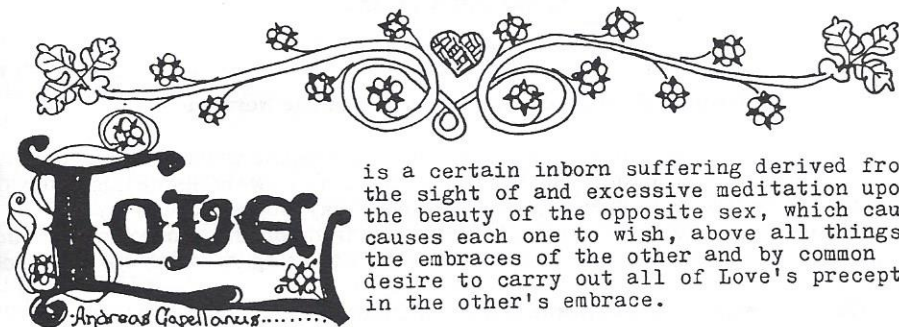


# "HISTORY"

From the information I've been able to put together I'd like to show the history of our shire as I've researched from past issues of the Windswept which has always been the newsletters name. In February 1982 there was a Frontier Army Sweetheart Ball at the Recreation Center at F.E. Warren Air Force Base. Quite by accident, several people, while talking learned that they were SCA members and/or knew others. In all ten members were present. It was decided to meet in two weeks and the shire was born. The first name considered was "Windraven", but was modified to "Windhaven" for submission. Not passing, "Winddragon" was tried (in about 1985) and also failed (there was a Windwyvern). Staying with birds, the next try in January AS XX (1986) was "Gryphon's Keep" (there was a Gryphon's Tower), again failure. The last try was with the "Windkeep" passing in March AS XXI (1987). We started in the Principality of the Outlands Kingdom of Atenveldt. We were for the split that resulted in the Principality moving up to kingdom. The shire made kneeling pillows for regalia for the first Outland crown on June 14 AS XXI (1986). By our reckoning this is the list of Seneschals:

**Bragg's Tongue** - an insult and challenge match.

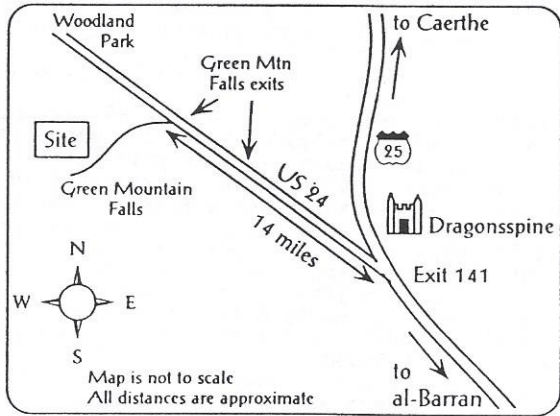
**Ragnar's Rags** - a contest for the most authentic Viking garb.
