

From The Knight Marshall

From Viscount Stefan of the Wanders: Kingdom Earl Marshall Guidelines for Non-Combatants on the Fighting Field

This guide is just that, a guide and not a set of steadfast rules or laws. In some cases they are based on the "Rules of the List". What I have written here is based on years of experience as a fighter, healer, and marshall. These guidelines are intended for everyone that will be on the fighting field as a non-fighter. These roles might be as follows: Field Marshall, Herald, Healer, Water Bearer, Minister of the List, squire (not fighting at the moment) or consort. I have found that for many "non-fighters", they are not totally familiar with the proper etiquette and customs of the fighting field. To become more familiar it would be advantageous to review the "Marshall's Handbook". After reviewing this, as well as the rules of the list, you should be ready to receive your authorization card.

REMEMBER: The marshall is in charge of the field. This position of responsibility is an extension of the crown, it that as defined by Corpora, "the marshall is the King's representative on the field". In essence all that happens on the field is the responsibility of the marshall in charge. What this means for the non-combat is that your presence on the field is with marshall's permission. In case of the tournament field your presence will be under more direct control than say war or melee situations.

TOURNAMENT FIELD - Your actions and role on the field will differ slightly from the tournament field to the melee field. To begin with your very presence on the field is determined by the marshall in charge. This can vary from marshall to marshall, but in all cases should be worked out prior to the start of the tournament or your assumption of the role you are to preform.

For the field herald who will be on the field at the start and end of each fight (in most cases), the working relationship is very important and depends on continued communication. The marshall must be able to communicate to the herald when their presence on the field is needed. (This applies to everyone entering on the field.) This "form" of communication may be nothing more than a simple nod of the head, or a prearranged gesture. This prearranged gesture might be an indication of the victor (Marshall's please note: Many consider it in bad taste to point the business end of your marshalling staff at either fighter as an indication of their victory.) or to introduce the combatants.

For all others their presence on the field is determined by the marshall. Healers should not be too quick to jump onto the field, as many fighters have prearranged death scenarios. Water bearers can usually provide aid to the fighters after they come off the field. If needed they will be called to the field. Usually a simple gesture by the marshall will allow a squire, consort, or other assistant—onto the field. Usually the minister of the lists—does not enter the field, but communicates with the marshall either off the field or through the field heraid.

At no time should someone not a marshall be on the field while the fighting is going on. What this ultimately means is that if you're going to be on the fighting field you must be aware of what is going on and around the field at all times.

WAR AND MELEE FIELD - The melee field often appears to be in a state of chaos. Communication to all participants is inherently more difficult just due to the size and nature of the fighting. Because of this non-combat participants must be aware of what is going on at all times. They must be able to preform their assigned task for the role they are portraying and at the same time not be in the way of the fighting or be the cause for harm to either themselves or other participants.

Each non-combatant on the field assumes a slightly more expanded role on the melee field. Where the field marshall is responsible on the tournament field for safety and condition of the fighter and his armor: this responsibility is spread to other non-combatants on the melee field. A water bearer should, when forcing their water and aid on the fighters, also take a look at the overall condition of the fighter. This includes his physical condition as well as the condition of his


armor. Often times during melees armor will be damaged or lost without the fighter knowing of the loss. Sometimes in the heat of battle they may have received an injury or become over-heated; conditions that may become serious if not attended to. As a water bearer or healer you can talk to the fighter and bring this condition to mind. If necessary bring a condition that needs remedy to the field marshall if the fighter doesn't or isn't able to respond. Remember though, it is the marshall's ultimate decision as to who remains on the field.

DRESS: Your choice of clothing ultimately should be chosen for safety on the field, with obvious consideration towards personal personae. Briefly things you should consider are ease and speed of movement and protection from the elements (weather and the physical field itself) Choice of clothing that promotes ease of movement (without getting tangled up in sagebrush) is more important for wars and melees where the chance of getting caught "in the action" is higher than on the tournament field. Comfortable and good fitting foot wear are very important in these situations. A hat and sunscreen are other items to consider for your continued personal comfort. In the Outlands we request that to help prevent accidents that no one have live steel (bladed weapons) on the field. If you are carrying equipment on the field either as a water bearer or as a healer make it easy to carry without getting in the way.

HOLD! - Anyone may call hold to stop the fighting. This should only be done for a valid reason such as an armor malfunction, dropped weapon (Remember that if they are carrying another weapon no hold should be called.), an unauthorized presence on the field (animal or human), or a potentially dangerous situation not recognized by the marshall on the field. The calling of hold should not be abused!

I hope in the above ramblings that I have provided a basic sense of direction for those that wish to participate as a non-combatant. Your specific duties on the field will be more detailed than the mear mentions afforded them in the afore mentioned pages. These duties you will learn as part of your non-combatant role.



UNSER HAFEN PLUNDER TOURNEY!




Well, here it is, July, and not a tourney in sight, very close anyway. So I've decided to hold one.

The area has it's share of cactus and boots are suggested for everyone. All pets must be leashed and children will need to be supervised.

Again this is the San Juan Mountains, come prepared. There is a small local store about 5 miles from the site, but only necessities are carried there.

Mostly woods battles are planned, with some other scenarios as well. A quest, hugging auction, bardic circle and other surprises are planned.

Merchants are welcome but encouraged to get reservations in early due to limited space, a \$10.00 fee will be charged.

We stress this is a discreetly wet site, period containers only!!

The site fee has been lowered to \$5.00 for members, \$8.00 for non-members and children under twelve half-price.


Remember the site is 31 miles from Farmington and about 25 miles from Durango. Signs will be well posted from both directions.

Demo Update 30.

On April 27th of this year the Shires of Windkeep and Unser Hafen presented a demo at Thompson Valley High School in Loveland, Colorado. The demo presentation included displays on herbal lore, needlework, costumes, weapons and armor-making, music, and heraldry as well as many other things. It was followed by a fighting demo and questions from the students. Below is a letter recently received by the Shire:

Dear Bonnie:

Please forgive the tardiness of this note, but I haven't seen Fred for several days and I wanted to talk with him before writing this note. He said that you could convey our thanks to the Cheyenne group of SCA for their effort and time in coming to visit our classes a couple of weeks ago and I certainly would appreciate you doing that.

The kids very much enjoyed the table talks and set ups indoors, although most of them said twice as long, to look carefully and touch, would have been better. I agree. And we got the feeling of how much preparation went into all of your presentations when we saw the combatants and watched them prepare for that. An additional hour would have done it!

Many of our students took the SCA cards that Tehri gave me, and I'm returning the extras with Fred. Again, thanks for helping us educate our moderns about ye goode olde days.

The shire presented yet another demo on June 1st for the 3rd-graders at Alta Vista Elementary School here in town. The demo again had displays as well as talks on costumes, herbal lore, needlework, children's roles in the Middle Ages, weapons & armormaking, music, and castle life. It was followed by fighting and lessons in medieval dancing. The children asked random questions and took great interest in the presentation.

A troll will be at the Feasthall to sign in all those attending the Feast.



---BOOK REVIEW--by Lady Gwyneth Maeve of Falconguard

PROUD KNIGHT, FAIR LADY
translated by Naomi Lewis, illustrated
by Angela Barrett

I never expected to find myself searching for medieval books in the children's section of The Stone Lion in Ft. Collins, but after seeing a beautifully illustrated fairy-tale book (it was like a medieval manuscript) owned by Baron Dirik, I decided to try my luck. What I discovered went beyond pretty illustrations.

The book I found, Proud Knight, Fair Lady, just happened to be an English translation of the Twelve Lays of Marie de France. Not much is known of Marie other than she wrote her lays in the latter half of the 12th century, lived in France but spent part of her life in England, and was likely of high social status.

All twelve stories are presented in this book, and in true, timeless (after all, they're at least 700 years old) fairy-tale fashion, the stories are of valiant knights, fair ladies, swan messengers, magic ships, hawk-princes, and cities where "every single house and hall and tower seemed to be made of silver". The stories include one in which a knight changes into a wolf---a good wolf, strangely enough, one of the few to be found in medieval literature.

One thing to remember is that these stories, at the time, were meant to be told to an adult audience. Outside of some of the difficult-to-pronounce names, I think reading aloud these tales would delight SCA'ers of all ages---the stories are told as though Marie de France were speaking before you. In addition, the tales indirectly tell much about the customs, thoughts, and desires of the medieval mind.

A last note about the book---it has beautiful illustrations!
