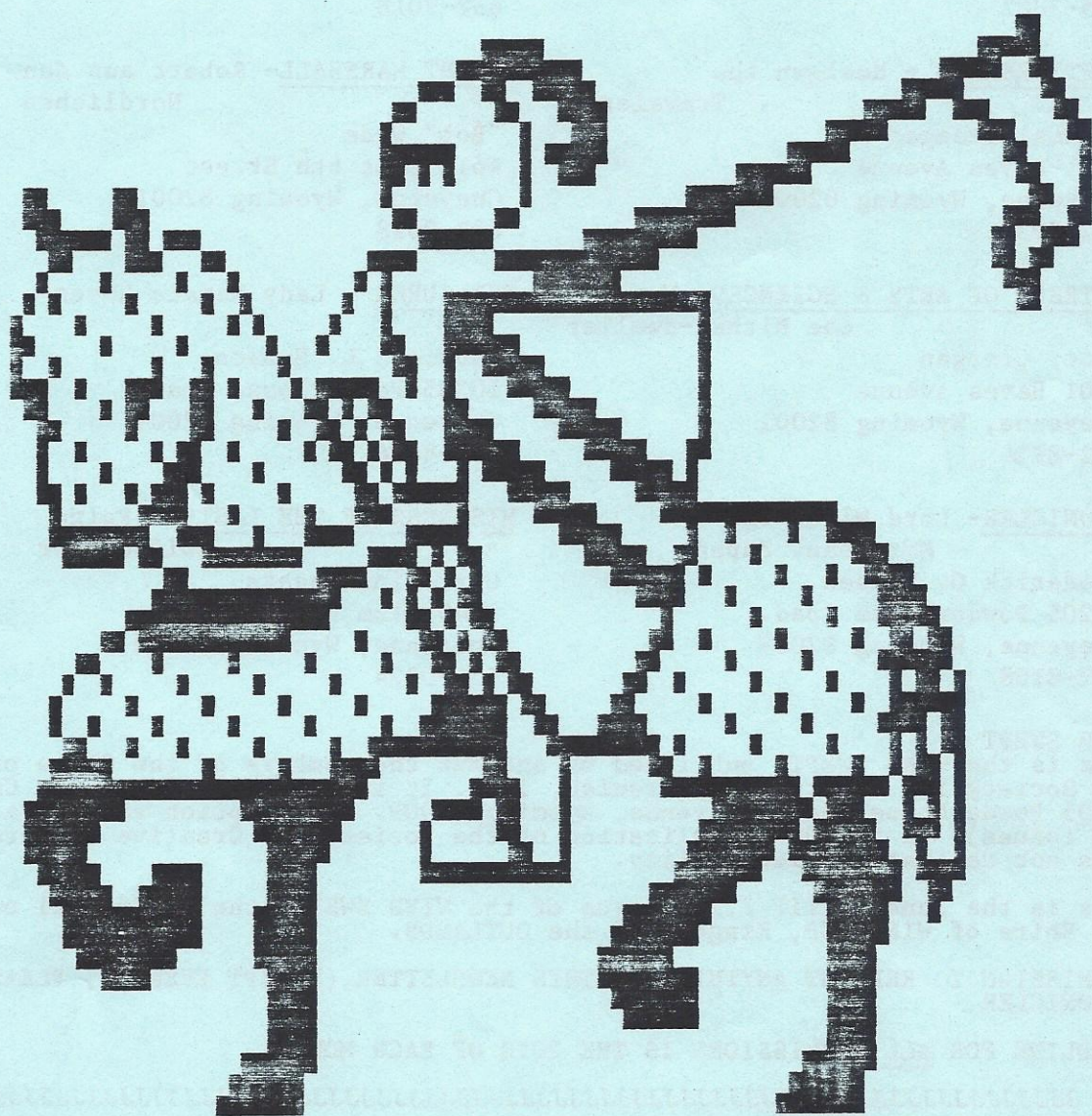

# Oasis Journey

It is late June. During the longest days of the year, the merciless sun pours down upon the weary caravans of travelers as they wend their way across the sere and windy plains of the Northern Outlands. But the terrible journey is justified by the pleasures that await these travelers at the Oasis.

Join us for the second annual Oasis Tourney. We will again have workshops, an inn selling Saturday lunch and soft drinks, a tavern dispensing beer for donations, an evening tourney, a late evening Middle Eastern feast, Sunday breakfast, and of course, drumming and dancing much of the time. Merchants are welcome!

When? The dates are Saturday June 25 and Sunday June 26. The site is available for set-up Friday night, but you must pay the Forest Service to camp there as a private citizen.

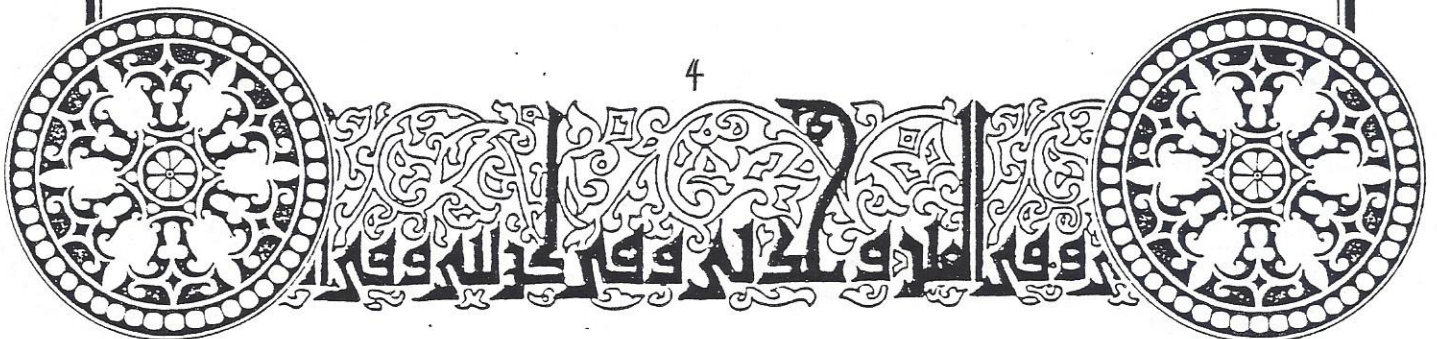
Where? We are at the same site as last year, the Crow Valley Recreation Area in the Pawnee National Grasslands, in Briggsdale, Colorado.

How Much? Site Fee: \$5.00 for members, \$6.00 for non-members. Feast Fee: \$5.00 postmarked by June 1--\$7.00 by June 15--\$10.00 thereafter. Breakfast Fee: \$2.00, \$3.00, \$4.00. Children under 13, half price. The early registration fees have not changed from last year.

WARNINGS: 1. Mosquitoes also love the Oasis. Bring your own repellent, protective clothing, etc. 2. Be ye forewarned that this is out in the boonies, folks. There are NO nearby eateries. If you do not want to eat the feast/breakfast, then bring your own food. Hungry children may have supper early.

\*MUNCHKINS\* We have openings for Munchkins. Three people may eat the feast free in exchange for cleaning up afterwards. One free feast to an expert barbeque-er to grill the lamb steaks. Also, two breakfasts free to clean-up people for breakfast. These must be arranged in advance with Mistress Elizabeth.

The site has lots of trees, decent outhouses, and running water. The site also has lots of mosquitoes--bring heavy-duty repellent, and also bring good sunscreen if you plan to leave the shade. Fires in designated areas only. This is a wet site.

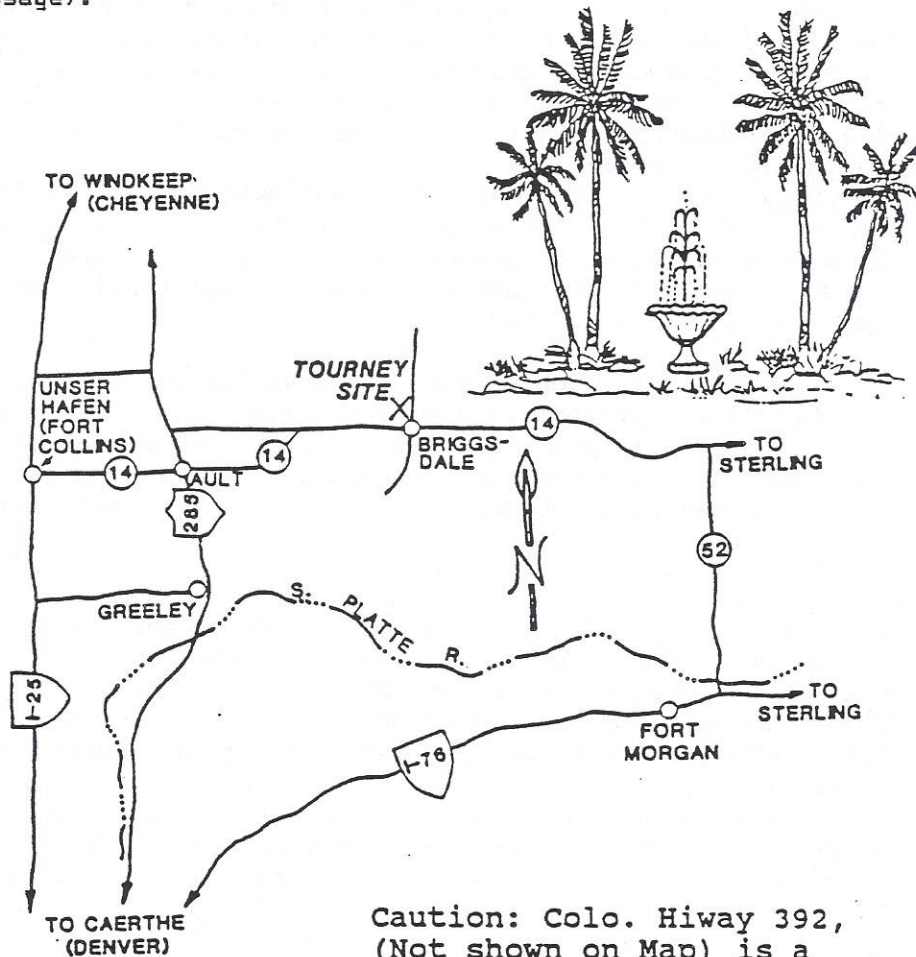

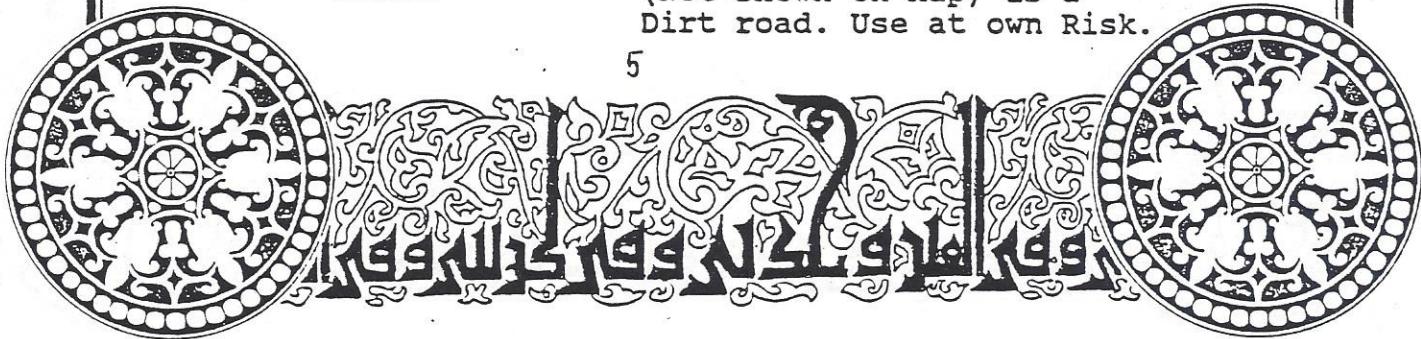

The event shall start with armor inspection at 11:00 and the Tourney shall begin at 12:00. There shall be games available for non-fighters and an Arts and Sciences Competition for all. There is a \$1.00 Site Fee, which is refundable to those entering the Arts and Sciences Competition. The Celts were the first to develop and utilize the horseshoe. Thusly our A&S Competition is based on the horseshoe. All entries must incorporate the horseshoe in the formation of the entry. Fancy work, needlecraft, as well as other forms of design are acceptable. All entries will be judged and prizes shall be awarded for: Most Original Use of a Horseshoe, Best Celtic Theme and Judges Whim. Challenge Fighting on Sunday 12-?, if there is any interest. Limited showers are available at the tourney site. The Feast Hall shall open at 5:00 for setup prior to the feast. The first course shall be served promptly at 6:00. Feast reservations are due not later than 1 July A.S. XXIII. There shall be **NO** feast tickets available after that date. The Feast consists of:

Course Three	Sotelties

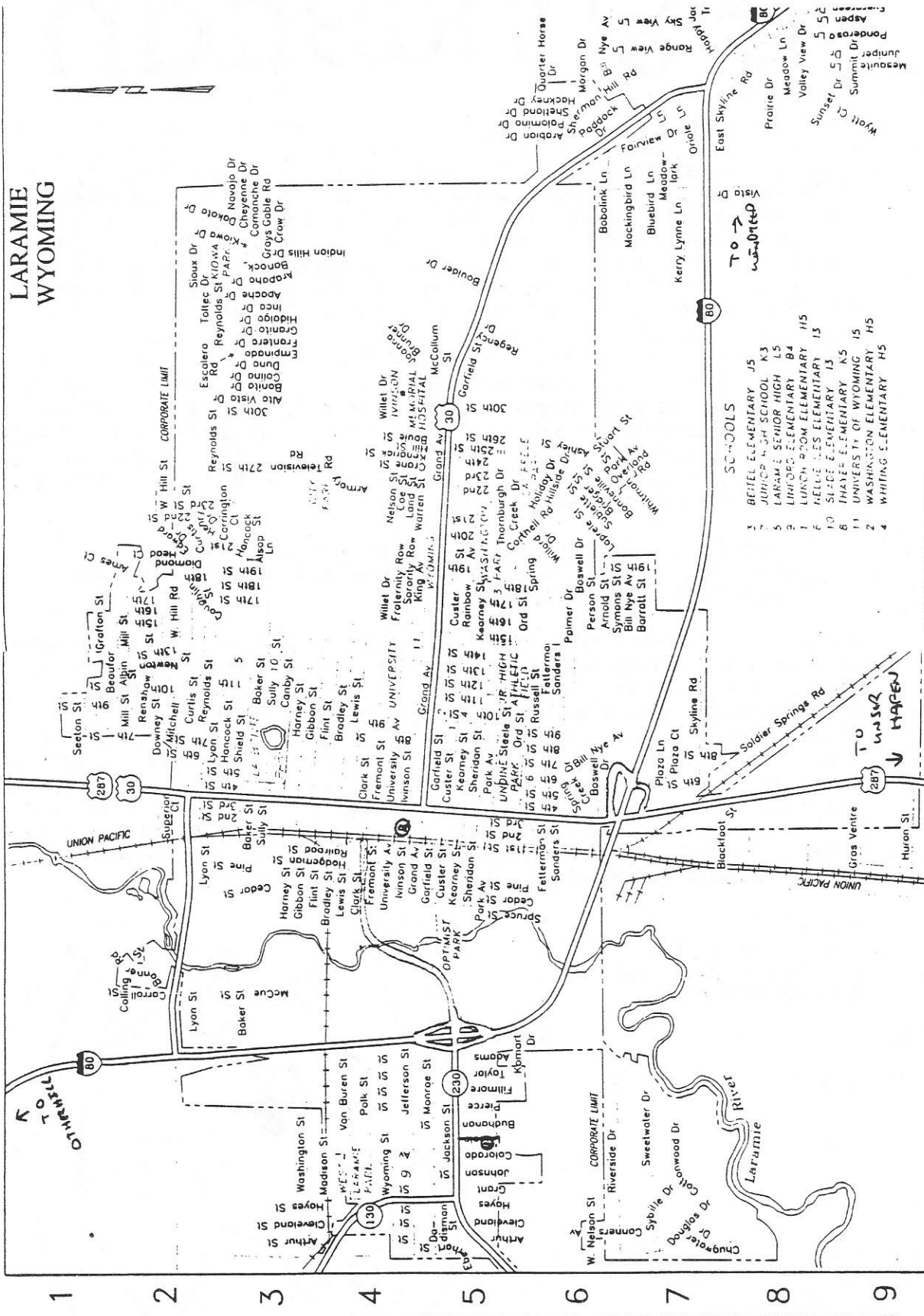
Bread, butter, fresh fruit and nuts shall be on the table(s) at the start of the feast. Those wishing to attend, having dietary restrictions please contact the autocrats, when sending in reservations. FEAST FEES: Ages 13 to Adult \$8.00, ages 6 to 12 \$4.00 and ages 5 and under Free.

RESTRICTIONS: Smoking in designated areas only. No pets allowed at either site. The Tourney Site is **WET** and the Feast Site is **DRY**. EXCEPTION: If there are less than 21 feast reservations received by 1 July A.S. XXIII, the Feast Site will be changed to the same as the Tourney Site, and thusly will become a wet site. 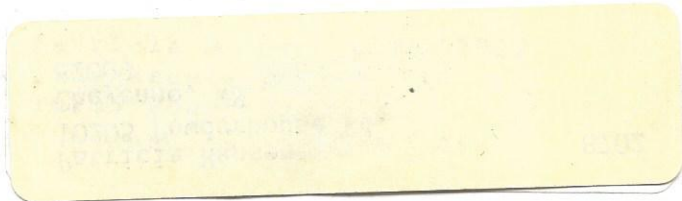
