Les Couturieres Defender Tourney and Feast

The Ladies and Gentlemen of Les Couturieres invite the People of the Outlands to attend their Fourth Annual Defender Tournament and Feast to be held March 18th in the Barony of Dragonspine. The site is the Sallie Bush Community Hall. Take I-25 to the Pike's Peak exit and US 24. Take the second Green Mountain Falls exit and follow the signs. (See map below).

The Defender Tourney will be run single-combat, double-elimination, any weapons forms. All entrants will be required to perform a short bardic performance with a partner before or during the Tourney. This activity will not count towards the Defender Title, but a special prize will be awarded for the Most Entertaining Performance. All entrants in the Tourney must display their device upon a surcoat, shield, or banner.

The winner of the Tourney will be proclaimed the Household Defender and will be presented with a chainmail coif (pronounced KWOFF!), the Household Favor, the Defender Sword, and a scroll. The winner will also be provided a Twelfth-Night costume for the following year, as well as the adoration and appreciation of the Ladies! The Tourney is open to all authorized fighters who reside in the Kingdom of the Outlands. There will be indoor *and* outdoor facilities for fighting.

Other prizes will be given for Most Chivalrous/Courteous Fighter, Best Dressed Fighter, Most Beautiful Male/Female Garb, Best Table Setting, and Most Well-Behaved Child.

The Feast will consist of Salad, Italian pepperoni and cheddar cheese rolls, Baked Chicken with Mushrooms, Rice Pilaf, Green Beans with Almonds, Beef Stew, and Cheese Cakes with fresh fruit. Please contact the Autocrat with special dietary requirements or allergies. Persons wishing to serve or help clean up will eat free, so contact the Autocrat if you wish to volunteer. Feast fees will be \$10 until March 10th - NO RESERVATIONS AVAILABLE AT THE DOOR. Children under 12 are free, and persons wishing to attend only the Tourney will be charged a \$3 site fee. 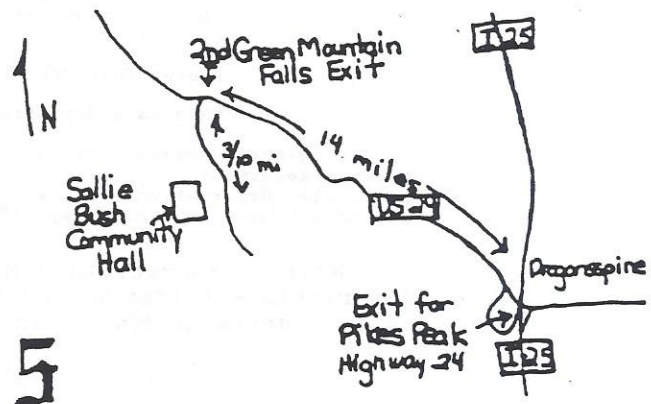

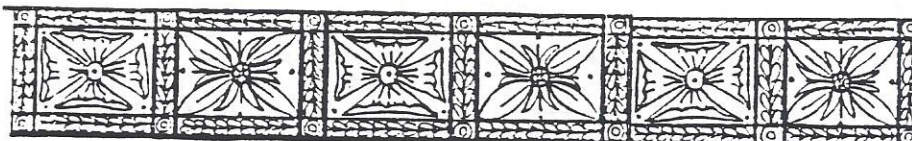




Persian New Year Unser Wafen March 25

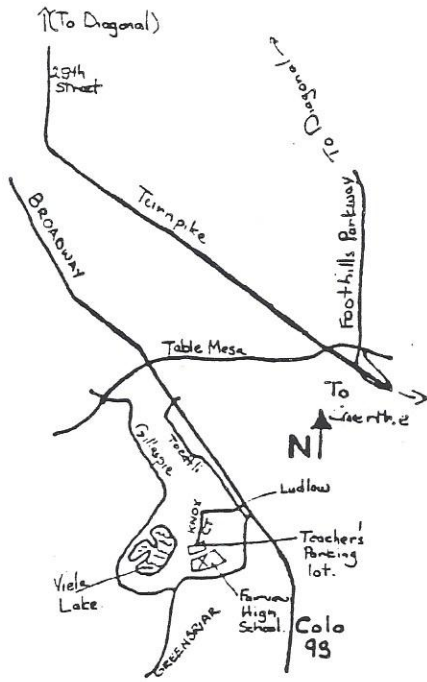

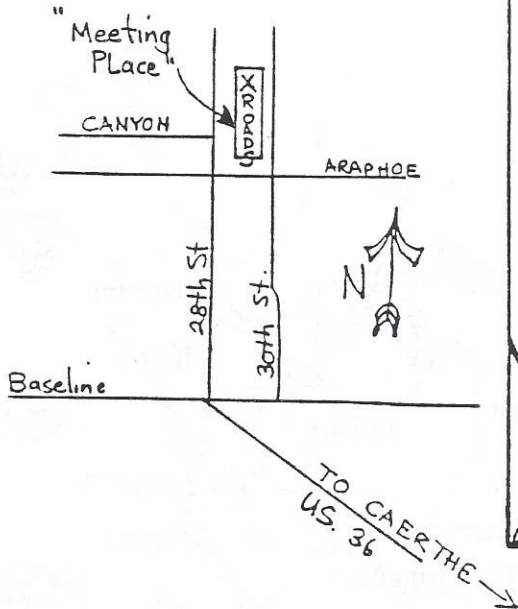

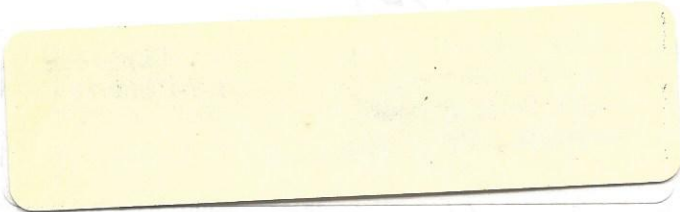
