

Windkeep's Banner Tourney!

Good gentles of the Outlands, hearken: The Shire of Windkeep doth heartily invite all to attend their BANNER TOURNAMENT AND FEAST, to be held upon SATURDAY, JUNE 24, 1989. There will be prizes for the winners of the List, outdoor dancing, and a contest for Best Banner. Fighters, in order to participate in the List, you must show that you have brought a banner (can be begged, stolen, borrowed, etc). Banners may display personal arms, historical arms, or be just plain decorative---and can be any size from polearm pennon to royal standard. The more, the merrier!

As this tournament is being held as a part of Superday '89, an entertainment and craft fair held by the City of Cheyenne, we ask all gentles to wear their finest tourney garb and bring any articles they wish to display in our Arts and Sciences Tent (We hope to recruit new members at this event). Merchants are also welcome (the Superday organizers have allowed SCA merchants to merchant for free)!

Following the day's festivities, Lady Renate and M'lady Aldith have connived to produce a delectable feast, after which there will be more dancing. Feast reservations must be limited to 50 persons, however, so please send them in early.

TOURNEY SITE: The field across from the Cheyenne Botanic Gardens in Lions Park (710 Carey Avenue, Cheyenne, WY)

FEAST SITE: Isaak Walton Hall, 1320 Talbot Court (NOTE: This is a DRY site, and all candles must be in containers).

THE TOURNAMENT WILL BEGIN AT 11:00. Please arrive early enough to armor up and get inspected. The site opens at 9:00 am, and parking will become a premium after 10:00 am. The feast will begin at approximately 5:00 pm.

THE BANNER FEAST: First course (on the table): Breads, biscuits, honey and plain butter, fresh vegetables.

Second course: Garden Vegetable Soup

Third course: Chicken Breasts in Wine, Rice Pilaf, Cucumbers with Honey-Poppy-seed Dressing, Minted Vegetables

Fourth Course: Meatballs, Sweet-and-sour Onion & Raisin Relish, Tossed Salad with Dressing.

Dessert: The feastocrats have declared that there will be at least 3 different varieties available.

Beverages: As this is a DRY site, Chilled Tea and Mock Sangria will be served.

GENERAL INFORMATION: Crash space is available for those who wish to stay overnight and return to their homes Sunday morning; contact the Autocrat. Pets are allowed in the park, but must be on a leash. Even though traffic into the park will be prohibited during Superday (from 10:00-3:00 pm), SCA people will be allowed to get their cars into the park to unload, if necessary (cars must be taken out after unloading). The earlier you come, the better the parking!

Simple Steps to an Easy Banner

These are the notes I followed for our Banner-making session at the All Guilds Meeting on February 20th, 1988. We had a good turn-out (7 total), and in the process of learning these steps, we made a 24" x 36" banner depicting a black griffin upon a grey field for the Shire.

Materials: Just about any type of cloth can be used for a banner, provided that its reasonably sturdy (no flimsy cottons) and does not stretch (otherwise the appliqued designs may sag). This method outlines sewn-on designs, but iron-on cloth can be used if you're appreciably lazy. Felt may be used for the appliqued designs, but is not good for the background (it deteriorates quickly with use). In addition to cloth (in all the colors necessary), you will need a wooden dowel and bias tape for the edging (either the same color as the field or a contrasting color), as well as cord to hang it up.

1. Determine the approximate size of the banner. Remember, big banners look great from a distance. 24" x 36" is a good starter size. Don't cut the background material yet!
2. Make full-size paper patterns for all the pieces of the design that are different from the background color.
3. For each pattern piece, outline the design on a piece of proper-colored cloth with a piece of chalk or a soft colored pencil. Don't forget to draw in any interior lines, too.
4. Using the satin-stitch (close zig-zag) on the sewing machine, sew along all of the lines of the design (both the outline and the interior lines). You may wish to use a contrasting color so that the lines stand out.
5. Cut the sewn piece out, cutting close enough to the satin-stitched edge so that the edges aren't too frayed. You now have one piece of your design. Follow steps 3-5 for all of the pattern pieces.
6. Spread out the background cloth on a flat surface and arrange all of the cloth design pieces in their proper places. Check the laid-out design against your measurements for the final banner—if the main design looks crowded, enlarge the measurements slightly; if the design seems lost in the huge field, make the banner smaller.
7. Cut out the banner out of the field material, adding 2" to the top to allow for the amount of material that has to be folded over to slip the dowel through. If your banner is shield-shaped, you may have to add extra at the bottom so that the amount of space the design must fit in doesn't get cut too narrow. To get a shield-shape, fold the material in half and cut a curve off the bottom.
8. Sew bias tape along the entire edge of the banner.
9. Fold the top edge over 1"-2" towards the back and sew down to form a sheath for the dowel. If the bias tape is a contrasting color, it makes the banner look better if you sew a piece of the bias tape in front along the stitched line.
10. Lay banner flat and arranged all of the design pieces in their places, then loosely pin them down. Have someone hold the banner while you stand back and look at it. If it doesn't look right, re-pin it until it does.
11. When you're satisfied with the placement, then add more pins until the edges of all parts of the design are as flat as you can get them. Make sure the design lays flat.
12. Using a straight stitch on the sewing machine, sew around the edges of all the pieces to attach them to the banner (make sure you use the same color thread that you used to satin-stitch them). Usually just sewing around the edges is sufficient, but if the pieces pucker up too much, then sew down some of the inside lines as well.
13. Run the dowel through the top fold, tie some cord at each end, and hang!

This is a wet site, with minimal restrictions, there is little to no shade on site, there is no water and no facilities. A porta pottie will be provided.

All of the weekend activities will be posted on a board in the center of Village Square. If you have specific concerns you may contact the autocrat.

There is NO running water on site! Please bring your own water and containers. There will be a water buffalo on site, however, available water is limited.

Bringing pets is HIGHLY discouraged. There is a definite risk of plague. Leashes will be required on ALL pets. (no exceptions) *(Baron Stefan has ordered that dogs worthy may petition for entrance into NOOBIES - Noble Order of Exempted LeaShed Animals.)* Appropriate ID and rabies tags will be required. NO pet will be allowed on site without them. Bring ample amounts of flea powder and repellents. If any dead rodents are found, please contact the healers or the sheriff's office for proper removal.

Master Gunwaldt will head the melees on Sunday, including the 30 Year War and The Great Guido War, (a woods resurrection battle).


A Fencing Tournament will be held on Saturday. The entry fee is a bottle of spirits. The winner takes the goods. Don Equivarian is in charge of this.

- House Halogaland cookies






UNSER HAFEN DEFENDER

LADY ELAINE OF VALYNWOODE'S HERBAL HELPS

ANISE- Considered by the ancients to be an herb powerful in fighting against evil. Supposed to discourage nightmares. Used by Charlemagne and grown in his herb gardens. It was raised in English monastery gardens by the 14th century and raised in common gardens by the 16th century. It is mentioned in the Bible and brought over to the new world by early settlers of Virginia. **CURRENT HERBCRAFT:** For colds use in hot tea form. For cooking use in breads, cakes and cookies. Fresh anise is used in soups and stews. Add at last minute because it cooks quite fast.
Cold Remedy: Bruise 2 ounces of seeds in a pestle or mortar. Place in pitcher and pour 2 cups boiling water over seeds. Steep 15 minutes, cool and strain. For 1 year olds give 1 tsp. For children over 4 give 3 tsp.


ALMONDS- Good for healing the body internally. Grind 6 Tablespoons of almonds in a pestle. Add 1 pint of cold water, and drink. Also good for facial scrub, cosmetics, sedative and sweet almond is a substitute for peanut butter. Usually tolerated well by diabetics.

ANGELICA- Has a strong odor and spicy taste. Relieves menstrual periods, digestive problems, rises the spirits, strengthens the stomach and increases the appetite. Also good for headaches chlorosis, hysteria and other nervous disorders. May be taken in doses of $\frac{1}{2}$ to 1 tsp. of powder mixed with water or spirits. **CAUTION:** Roots when fresh, are poisonous and shouldn't be used in an infusion. After drying they lose their poisonous properties.

APPLE- Good for constipation, inflamed eyes, fevers, and skin. Can be used in raw poultices on sprains and inflamed eyes. Apple cider vinegar is good for the skin. Apple cider vinegar is usually the basis for most poultices and medicines.

CAMPHOR- This is a mild stimulant. Sometimes relieves headaches and hiccups. Given in large doses, it's depressing and is eliminated rapidly. It came to Arabia and was introduced to Europe in the Middle Ages.

CARDAMOM- Recorded in use in 20 B.C. by the Romans and Greeks. Vikings spread the herb through raids and trading. It's mentioned in the Eddas and other Norse Sagas. It is a member of the ginger family. Pleasant to the taste, warm and stimulating to the stomach. Aids in digestion. Good for colic.


SWASHBUCKLER'S ROMP AND STICKY WICKET CROQUET TOURNEY
