

Due to University graduation, hotel rooms are full, and restaurants will be very busy. Merchants are welcome there is no fee. Please call merchant coordinator if interested.

Fees for the weekend are as followed: Site Fee is \$10 with a family cap of \$25. There is an additional charge of \$2 a tent. Feast Fee is \$5. 

T minus 8 and counting battle scenarios are planned for each day to liven your heart and your blade. Heavy weapons contests will include combat archery and missle/siege weaponry. Fencers, be prepared to run the same gauntlet as the heavy fighters. Archers remember, rounds will be shot and scored for Kingdom Royal Archer.

To honor this momentous occasion, some of your old favorites will return to the Bizarre. Their Excellencies, Sir Haroun and Lady Dovita will be your Autocrats for the [T minus] 7th time. Royal Archer Tournament

May 23-25, A.S. XXXIII (1998)

The Fifth Royal Archer Tournament will once again be held concurrently at Brigand's Bizarre and Grand Outlandish to accommodate the maximum possible number of entrants.

In order to compete, an archer must:

1. Be a current paid member of the Society for Creative Anachronism in the Kingdom of the Outlands, and provide proof of membership at the time of the tournament.

2. Be a Kingdom ranked archer (Yeoman, Forester, or Bowmaster), OR if recognized and recorded as an Outlands Bowman, may shoot in a Qualifying Round held prior to the Royal Archer Tournament. New or Novice archers are not allowed to compete for the position of Royal Archer.

3. Use SCA legal archery equipment.

Any archer ranked Yeoman, Forester, or Bowmaster may compete in the SUNDAY Tournament without shooting in the Qualifying Round to be held on SATURDAY at each location.

Any archer ranked Bowman may shoot in the Qualifying Round on SATURDAY to achieve the Kingdom rank of Yeoman or above (a Royal Round score of 45 or over). This is the only opportunity for an archer to become a Kingdom ranked (Yeoman) archer with only one qualifying score.

The position has been established by tradition to be held for one year, thus providing an excellent opportunity for the Royal Archer to be in court through all of the major events where the Outlands is represented.

Da'ud Bob's Movie Reviews

I love sequels, don't you? Of course, there are sequels, and then there are "sequels". Usually, though, the sequel just never matches up to the original. Sometimes, in fact, the sequel does not even come close to the original. (Deathstalker II comes immediately to mind, for some reason. I don't know why - the first one wasn't all that great. But it did make Deathstalker III look positively cerebral by comparison.) Sometimes, however, as with the following movie, the studio is so sure, so certain that the original is going to be a big hit, that they start on the sequel even before the original is released to the theaters. They sign up all of the stars of the original (well, all those that didn't get killed off in the original) and start filming almost immediately. In fact, they pushed production through so quickly, that the sequelactually was released before the original. Which, of course, makes it a lot harder to tell whether The Robe is the original, or whether it is a prequel. In fact, the opening scene of this one is the closing scene in The Robe, with Richard Burton and Jean Simnmons marching off to martyrdom. In any case, and before I bust a brain circuit trying to figure it out, This month Da'ud Bob reviews Demetrius and the Gladiators.


Starring Victor Mature reprising his role of Demetrius of Corinth, Susan Heyward as Messalina (wife of Claudius and Priestess of Isis), Michael Rennie as "The Big Fisherman" Peter, Debra Paget as Lucia, Richard Egan as Claudius, Ernest Borgnine as Strabo, the chief gladiator trainer for Claudius, and Jay Robinson as Caligula, this one is, as the opening credits inform you, "Based on a character created by Lloyd C. Douglas in 'The Robe'". Which, of course, makes it at least two steps removed from anything like actual history. (My general rule of thumb is its at least one step removed from actual history when it's "based on the book/story/novel by ...". If it's "based on a character created" for a book, well, that's yet another giant step away from actual history.) I think the thumbnail sketch in the TV magazine summed it up best: "Mature dallies with Royal Hayward." It is, essentially, the story on one man's fall from grace and ultimate redemption.

Good points: Victor Mature looks really good in a mini-tunic.

Bad points: Hayward's "negligee". The bound book in Claudius' library. (Looks like it was bound n the 18th or 19th Century.) Romans calling them Christians. Calling themselves Christians. I didn't know that Roman wives took their husband's byname upon marriage, but there it was on their tomb: Marcellus + Diana Gallio". Mature's studded leather

"codpiece". The dance choreography. The costuming in general. The gold Lamé and sparkly dress fabric in particular.

Zero breasts. One-half gallon of blood. Eleven dead bodies (plus three dead tigers). Gladiators roll. Tigers roll. Dagger fu. Pottery fu. Fist fu. Sword fu. Net and trident fu. Tiger fu. Gratuitous gladiator school parties. Gratuitous belly dancing. Gratuitous fig leaves on all the statuary. Dance of the vestal not-so-Virgins. Academy Award nominations to Richard Egan as Claudius for "Men to not kill what they despise, only what they fear"; and to Victor Mature as Demetrius for "We need no gods, you and I; we need only each other" and for demonstrating once again that there is nothing in all this world so dangerous as an enraged pacifist. 57 on the Vomit Meter. Two stars. Da'ub Bob says "Check it out!"



The Stew Lot

I decided to publish some recipes this month. There is no implied periodicity.

Fruited Meat Balls:

Ground Meat Cinnamon Raisins or Currants Bread Crumbs

Peanut Oil for frying

Pick your favorite kind of ground meat. The leaner the better. If I don't use venison, I usually use ground turkey. Mix in enough bread crumbs to make a good meatball. Put in at least 2 tablespoons of cinnamon. It will depend on how much ground meat you use. Add some raisins or currants. Enough that the meatballs will have bunches of them. Make the meat stuff into balls. Heat peanut oil in a pan. You will need enough oil to cover the meatballs half way up. Fry the meatballs. They will be done when they turn really dark, and the raisins or currants puff up. Drain them on a paper towel. They will keep for a week in the fridge. Mine don't usually last that long.

Quick and Dirty Potato Soup

Whole Milk Potato Flakes Butter Parsley Salt Pepper Chives

Put how ever much milk you want into a pot big enough for soup. Put in the butter. Start heating it up slowly. When the butter melts, turn off the heat. Add salt to taste. Put in some parsley flakes. Then dump in the potato flakes, stirring constantly. When it gets thick enough for you, stop the potato flakes. Put in the pepper to taste. Chop some chives on top for garnish. This can be served hot or cold. It thickens a little more when it cools. If you have potato freaks you are serving, you can dump some frozen hash browns in just before you do the potato flakes. Gives them something to chew on.

The Soapbox

One of the great things about the SCA is having the opportunity to act differently than you would in everyday life. Part of that acting differently is the way you address those about you. I have on numerous occasions heard one gentle say to another, "Look, you don't have to call me [Sir, Master, Baron] William. Just call me Bill. In my opinion this aire of familiarity detracts from the pomp and ceremony that, for many, is what the SCA is all about. When we address each other in the same manner that we would in every day life, we are taking away a little part of the enchantment that makes the SCA different.

A person who has achieved a station beyond that point where we all start out deserves to have that added respect given him or her. Lord So-n-so should have his title added to his name the same way that Sir So-n-so, or Duke So-n-so should. Many people have worked very hard to reach the level they are at, and addressing them casually takes away much that they have worked for.. By showing a small amount of formality when we are in a medieval setting we show those around us, especially the mundane world, that we are more eloquent, and refined. Not only have we uplifted the person we are addressing by recognizing their station, but we have uplifted ourselves by showing that we are made of that special stuff.

Another benefit of being more formal when in a medieval setting is that those who have not yet been recognized for their accomplishments are more easily identified. If we skip the titles then we create a situation where everyone is equal. Maybe that's not bad, but it does a real disservice to the newer people because people begin to assume that they already have awards and titles that are just not being used. We have all been surprised when someone who has been around for years is called up to receive their Award of Arms, because we assumed that they were already Lord or Lady. By remembering to use a little more formality, these people are noticed more quickly.

Of course it is not necessary to always be formal. When people are in a mundane setting, it is certainly not necessary. In a close household setting, formality only really needs to be used as an initial greeting, or when someone new enters the conversation. Close friends may not need to be formal, but they should want to for the sake of their friend. However, when in a public medieval setting, we should all remember to be as formal as possible. It will not only make those around us feel better, it will make those around us feel better about us.
