### SCHOOL DEMO'S REPORT

Over many years, our Shire has built quite a reputation doing demonstrations for the local area, and in specific, the schools. We have done as few as 5 and as many as 13 in a single school year. We service the 5-6th grades primarily, and East High School. For the past couple of years, the primary demo team has consisted of Rhys, Renate, Bjarki, and myself. Noemi and Asta have assisted as their time permits, and so has Mlodn. With the loss of Bjarki and Asta this year to college, we are in need of teachers. During the next few weeks, I will be doing a call around to see what we can come up with before the schools start calling for our assistance. Please consider helping if you can.

Our demos follow a pretty prescribed script. Not because it is the right or only one, but because the schools are very comfortable with what we do. New ideas are welcome, and we will pass it on to the schools.

We come in a week before the primary demonstration to teach Heraldry. The schools already have our handout, and print one for each pupil. Depending on the number of classes, we need 1-3 people for this part, and it is from 1 hour to 3 hours in length. Basic Heraldry is taught, with an emphasis on the simple, and the encouragement of making their own heraldic device. We "grade" them as either an art grade or social studies grade, as the teacher wishes when we come back the next week. That part of the demo is somewhat harder. If the teachers have a specific area they want covered, we do that. If not, we have usually 2-3 hours to fill with 20 minute or so presentations on parts of Medieval life. Our usual coverage is real life in the Middle Ages (clothes, food, and medicines), Arms and Armor, Trivia, and Inheritance. If there are heavy weapons fighters who are willing, we have a 15 minute tourney. We have had fencing or dancing instead.

Nessa has put me in charge of scheduling, so let me know if you can help. You do not have to go to EVERY demo. Just one or two would help tremendously.

### KNIGHT MARSHAL'S REPORT

#### Greetings

We have been having some fun this summer, but with the coming of winter is it time to put away your armor in order to prevent the dreaded monster rust from damaging it? I think not!!! With great thanks to M'Lady Nessa, we have a winter fighting sight. Nessa, my most profound thanks go to you for your efforts in locating this site.

### HUNTER'S FEAST DECEMBER 5TH

The harvest has ended, the hunters are home, and Yuletide is fast approaching. The Shire of Windkeep asks all who will to pause with them to reflect upon the world and join them in a Hunters Feast to be held December 5, 1998 at the Laramie County Community College (LCCC) in Cheyenne, Wyoming. The site will open at 12 noon and close at 11:00 p.m.. This site is DRY. The event is limited to the first 175 reservations, and alcohol is not permitted on campus. If you desire crash space, or discount motel reservations, contact Master Rhys.

We need not be blessed with clear weather during the day, Windkeep's indoor Fighter's Practice Site at 5500 Bishop Blvd shall be available, therefore there will be heavy and light weapons pick-up fighting from 1:00 to 5:00. Indoors at the hall, there will be good fellowship, dancing, and whatever games as can be devised. Directions to Fighter's Practice available at the troll.

A bardic competition will be held during the feast, as in past years., with a gift of silver to the best entertainer. There will be a sign-in sheet at the troll.

Throughout the day there will be an informal competition for best hunters theme (garb/table setting/banner) to be arbitrarily judged by the kitchen staff.

There will be a soup and bread donation lunch from about 1:00 p.m. until about 2:00 p.m.. The main feast will start about 6:00 p.m. If the Crown attends, and so wishes, court will be held prior to the feast. The feast will consist of the bounty of the land and whatever the hunters and gatherers of Windkeep provide. If you are vegetarian, or have food allergies, or aversions, please contact Mistress Aldyth and she will prepare dishes suited to your tastes.

The fees for the event are as follows: Site and Feast \$10.00 with smalls under age 6 free, and those ages 6-12 half the price. For reservations made, but paid at the door \$15.00. For availability of reservations after Nov. 15, contact Mistress Aldyth directly. Please mail reservations to the autocrat, with checks made payable to SCA-Windkeep. Be sure to include legal name, society name, address, phone number and member number, and local group on your check Also include a list with all of the above information if you are paying for others.

### OUTLANDS CORONATION

#### Nahrun Kabirun, November 14, AS XXXIII (1998)

The Shire of Nahrun Kabirun is pleased and proud to be asked to host the coronation of our new King and Queen of the Outlands on Saturday the 14th of November, ASXXXIII. We welcome you to our warm and generous shire, the new site for the feast and coronation is at Celebration Hall at 100 N. Main St. and tourneys are at Mesilla Park Recreation Center, (304 W Bell) in Mesilla Park, New Mexico.

The tourney site will open at 8:30 a.m. and close at 5:00 p.m. on Saturday, and reopen from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Sunday for tourneys and war practice. Parking is available at and near the tourney site - but it is limited, so gentles should come prepared to carry their tourney gear a short distance.

The Lists for the Queen Champion Tourney and the Protector of the Queen's Heart will open at the marshall's discretion and both of the tourneys will begin after opening court which will be held at 9:00 a.m. There will be fruit, cheese and breads provided by the Shire of Nahrun Kabirun for all those participating in the tourney on Saturday and drinks will be sold as a shire fund raiser.

Since both tourneys will be held on Saturday, Sunday will be a full day of pickup tourneys, melees and war practice to begin at 10:00 a.m. There will be archery shoots along with the heavy and light weapon tourneys and war practice. This site will close at 5:00 p.m. The tourney site is dry. The shire will provide waterbearers and will also sell other liquid refreshments as a fundraiser. On Sunday the shire will hold a box lunch auction with scrumptious meals prepared by our populace with all proceeds going to TRM travel fund.

Coronation Court will be held at 6:00 p.m. and the feast will follow. A delicious feast will be prepared by the cooks of Nahrun Kabirun under the able direction of feast autocrat and head cook Lady Caer. The feast will follow the theme of 10th-11th century northern Europe and will include some vegetarian dishes. A list of ingredients will be available at the feast, however please contact Lady Caer if you have special dietary concerns. Wine and/or ale will be served with dinner as well as nonalcoholic beverages. There will be a cash bar revel after the feast and coronation until approximately, midnight. The tables will contain candles and linens so you will not need to bring those for your feast set up. Feast site will open at 4:30 p.m. on Saturday and close at 1:30 a.m. Sunday morning. There is amble parking at the feast site.

The shire has arranged for crash space among its members. We have also arranged for a block of rooms and a special SCA rate at the Sleep Inn of \$39.95 (plus tax) per night for 4 "official" guests per room. Rooms include 2 queen beds, bath and conteniental breakfast and use of the pool and jacuzzi facilities. A block of rooms and a special SCA rate has also been arranged at the Comfort Suites of \$54.00 (plus tax) per night for 4 "official" guests per room. Rooms include two beds, a separte room with a sleeper sofa, microwave, small refrigerator, a deluxe continental breakfast and use of the pool and jacuzzi facilities. Though two separate buildings with 2 separate facilities, they share a parking lot and are conveniently located to the I-25/University Ave exit and on the direct route to the site. Reservations must be made by calling the hotels directly and asking for the Society for Creative Anachronism group discount and reservations must be made by November 2nd to receive the discount. The number for reservations at the hotel is: (505) 522-1300, do not call the 800 reservation number.

There is camping (either tent, pavillion, or RV) available at Delmonte RV Park at 2224 S Valley (which is very close to the feast/tourney location). This location includes shower facilities and the rate is \$8 per night. Reservations are strongly suggested by calling Delmonte directly at (505) 523-2992 before November 2nd.

Directions to the Tourney Site: Take your best route to Las Cruces, New Mexico via I-25. Exit at University Ave. and go west down University Ave through 3 major intersections with traffic lights. Merge to the inside lane after the 3rd light. Travel to the next traffic light on the corner of University and El Paseo (apprx 1 mile from I-25 exit). Make a left turn onto El Paseo and travel south around a small curve (you will travel under the I-10 underpass) that puts you at the intersection of El Paseo and Main/South Valley with another traffic light. Continue straight, going west, the street will take you across a railroad track, into Mesilla Park and will now called Union Ave, continue past Harrelson St(1 block) to Linden(the second block), turn right on Linden. These are rural blocks, so they are long, but Bell is about 1 and 1/2 blocks on Linden to your left. The Mesilla Park Recreation Center sits at the corner of Linden, Bell, and Mansco. Their will be visible SCA signs and a troll booth on the outside of the building for registration.

Directions to the Coronation/Feast Site: Take your best route to Las Cruces, NM on I-25 and take the 6B exit West into Las Cruces. You will exit onto North Main St. Follow North Main, traveling west, through the intersection (with light) of Elks Drive and then continue through lights at El Camino Real and Spitz/Solano Ave. for about 1mile to 1 1/4 mile. The road will curve to the north ..... stay on Main through the intersection of Main and Madrid and travel approximately 1/4 mile past a Pizza Hut on your left to the Celebration Hall which is also on your left as you travel north. There is a very large parking lot for our use on the north side of the building. The building has a sign which says Desert Sun on the front, and Celebration Hall on the tall standing sign. There will be a troll booth inside the building. To arrive at the Feast Hall from motel crash space, simply go from Univ. Ave to I-25, and there will be directions given at the tourney site for best route from toureny site to feast site.

Site fee for the event is \$15 for nonmembers and \$10 for members, \$7 for feast only; children under the age of 6 are free. Everyone 6 or over theage of 6 who attends the feast must pay the feast fee. Make checks payable to SCA - Nahrun Kabirun. Reservations are suggested.

Be prepared to show your skills at indoor jousting and darts and other sundry games aimed at delighting you and sparking your laughter. Here is a grand opportunity to display your finery and imagination. Elegance shall be highly prized!

The site is the Adams County Fairgrounds northeast of Denver, Colorado. Site opens at 10:00 a.m. The Lunch stall will be open from 12:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. coinciding with the Game stalls and activities which will be open from 11:00 a.m. - 3:00 p.m.. Feast will be served at 6:00 p.m. after Royal Court. The day's schedule may be subject to change. This is a DRY site.

The gracious Lady Adelicia d'Alviela will prepare a sumptuous feast for 250 people of bread and flavored butters, lemon rice and garlic chicken, spinach and rice casserole, stuffed dates and sugared nuts, pickled eggs, olives, mushroom pasties, beef with bog berry pie, lemon bread and almond wafers. Menu is still subject to change and any updates will be published.



### DA'UD BOB'S MOVIE REVIEW

GUINEVERE \* \*



Now, I'll admit, Mistress Lassair had warned me about this one. Months before, she had mentioned it to me. I just wasn't expecting, on that pleasant evening, the videotape. (It is impossible to put in print the full effect of those chilling words, "the videotape". Trust me, it's far, far scarier in real life than it reads here in black and white. The soulless, lifeless words you only can read here should be read by Boris Karloff or Vincent Price or maybe Darth Vader for you to get the correct effect they have on me.) In any case, this month Da'ud Bob reviews the made for TV movie, Guinevere.

Starring Sheryl Lee in the title role, with Sean Patrick Flanery as Arthur, Noah (Dr. Carter) Wyle as Lancelot, Brid Brennan as Morgan le Fay, James Faulkner, and Donald Pleasence as a nearly bald Merlin, this well-crafted retelling of parts of the Arthurian legend from the viewpoint of his queen, Guinevere, is "based on the novels [please note the plural, there] of Persia Woolley". Guinevere as Warrior Queen. Guinevere as the "heart" or conscience of Arthurian Britain. Guinevere as the brains behind Arthur's brawn. All with what are occasionally extremely heavy overtones of 20th Century neo-paganism as the underlying foundation. In other words, Guinevere has almost as much to do with either real history or the Arthurian legends as Richard Gere's First Knight did.

In this version, Guinevere and Lancelot meet and fall in love in the north at "the sanctuary for the old religion" run by high priestess Morgan le Fay. It seems Lancelot was a foundling, and Morgan raised him. The two, with others, are being trained as "Warriors of the Triple Spiral", the triple spiral being the cycle of birth, life, and death. Now, Morgan wants to bring about Arthur's downfall, not because of anything her half-brother Arthur did, but because of what his father, Uther, did in raping Igraine, Morgan's and Arthur's mother. But Guinevere wants her father's blessing before she weds Lancelot, and this doesn't meet with Morgan's plans. After that, things get a lot more complicated.

Good points. Arthur's cloak. Not so good points. Camelot, Guinevere's kingdom, is placed in north central Britain. (Historically, the Arthurian legends are centered near Wales.) The use of coats of arms and heraldry. (Arthur was chronologically centuries before the advent of heraldry.) Merlin's cope at Arthur's coronation. The round table was Guinevere's idea. Maelgwn's castle is placed at the bottom of an extremely narrow valley; not a defensible place to put a castle. (When your foes can look down into the courtyard, you can't expect your men to be anything but slaughtered by a rain of weapons from the overlooking hills.) Arthur, like many another stick-jock, tends to think with his gonads. (It's realistic, but it's not a good point.) Arthur enthusiastically discussing the new wonder weapon, the crossbow.

Zero breasts. 1 1/2 gallons of blood. Eleven dead bodies. Fighters roll. Thunder rolls. Knife fu. Sword fu. Poison fu. Gratuitous grapes. Gratuitous rosebud. Gratuitous references to "the White God" and "the Goddess". Academy Award nomination to Sheryl Lee as Guinevere for playing the role with such passion. 92 on the Vomit Meter. Two stars. Da'ud Bob says "Check it out!"



### DA'UD BOBS' MOVIE REVIEW

CHRISTOPHER COLUMBUS \* \*

Water, water, everywhere, and all the plots did shrink; Water, water, everywhere, the script drove me to drink.

No, I know that's not how "The Rhyme of the Ancient Mariner" really goes. But my version here applies so much more to this month's movie about a different mariner. Or would you prefer, "In fourteen hundred and ninety-two, Columbus sailed, and sailed, and sailed, and sailed, and sailed the ocean blue"? Because that would apply to this movie, too. Or should we simply borrow, with minor modification, an old Hemingway title: "The Mad Man and the Sea"? Now, I'm not saying this little miniseries was long. Personally, I don't think it was any more lengthy or tedious than, say, Christopher Columbus' first voyage was for the common seamen aboard his ships. Day after day, nothing but empty horizon to look at. Yeah, that's about how this movie felt to me. And so it is that this month, Da'ud Bob reviews Christopher Columbus.

Starring Gabriel Byrne in the title role as the great navigator himself Faye Dunaway as Queen Isabella, and - in alphabetical order - Rossano Brazzi, Virna Lisi, Oliver Reed as the egotistical Captain Martin Pinzon, Raf Val lone, Max von Sydow as King John II of Portugal, Eli Wallach as Father Taliaferra, and Nicol Williamson as King Ferdinand, this 1985 mini-series actually doesn't do too bad a job of recounting the life and trials of the "Admiral of the Ocean Sea". There are some things in the movie that you have to ignore. For example, this is the first time I had ever heard that Columbus sailed to Scandinavia and heard the story of how Eric the Red discovered Vinland. (No, really! That's just the way the movie put it. As if 15th Century Scandinavians were (1) still recounting the story, and (2) didn't know the difference between Eric and his son, Leif "the Lucky" Ericsson.) As another example, they had Isabella, the Catholic Queen, expressing some anti-Inquisition and pro-Jewish sentiments Oh, yeah, that really would have happened. Not!

Good points. Chris's brother calls him Cristoforo. (A native Genoese, Columbus' name in Italian is Cristoforo Colombo.) Real mail armor. Much of the costuming was pretty well done. They filmed some scenes inside the Alhambra in Granada.

Bad points. (In addition to the Eric the Red story and Isabella's sentiments.) Signing documents with a feather. (Ask me about what a real quill pen looks like sometime.) Scimitars carried by the Moors in Granada. Belly dancing costume at Carnival. Columbus' brown hair. (He was totally white by the time he was 30.) The Spanish flag used by Ferdinand and Isabella is more modern than the one used during their lifetimes. 20th Century moral ideals espoused by 15th Century Spaniards. The Carib natives wearing loincloths and "bikini" tops. (Columbus was quite specific. When they greeted him, they were "naked".)

Zero breasts. 1 1/2 gallons of blood. 53 dead bodies. Waves roll. Fog rolls. Cigar smoke rolls. Fire fu. Musket fu. Sword fu. Fever fu. Cannon fu. Hurricane fu. Gratuitous gypsies. Gratuitous heretics. Gratuitous Hawaiian belly dance by "Carib" girls. Gratuitous love-making in the sand. Gratuitous anti-slavery sentiments. Gratuitous anti-Inquisition sentiments. Gratuitous pro-Jewish sentiments. Gratuitous ugly figurehead. No Academy Award nominations. A 93 on the Vomit Meter. Two stars. Da'ud Bob says "Check it out!"
