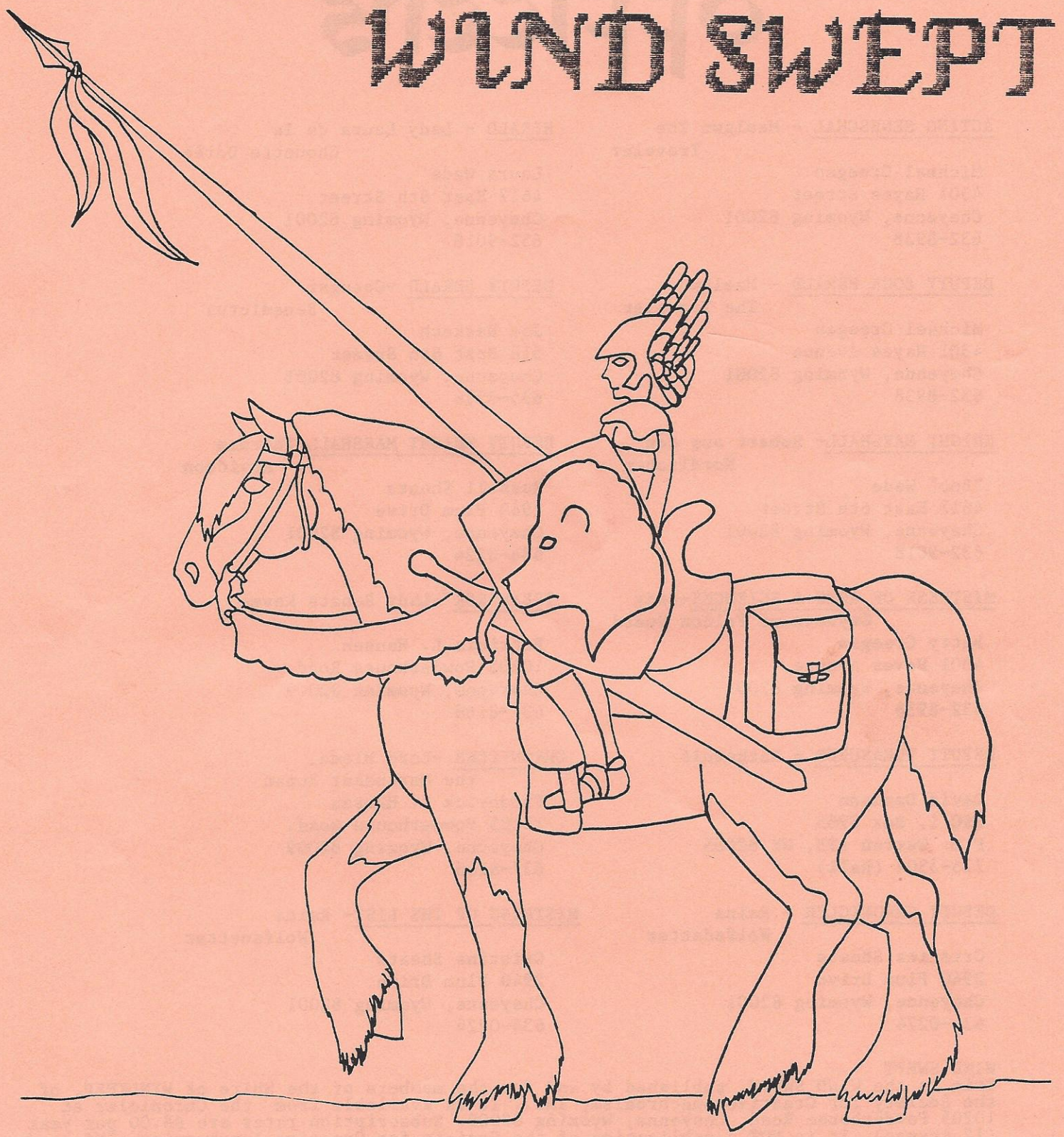
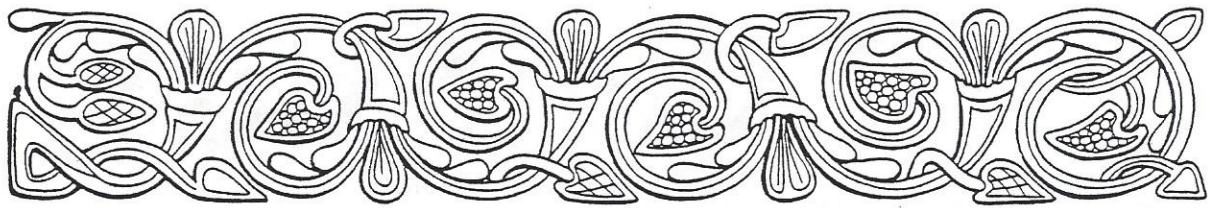

SATURDAY 8th

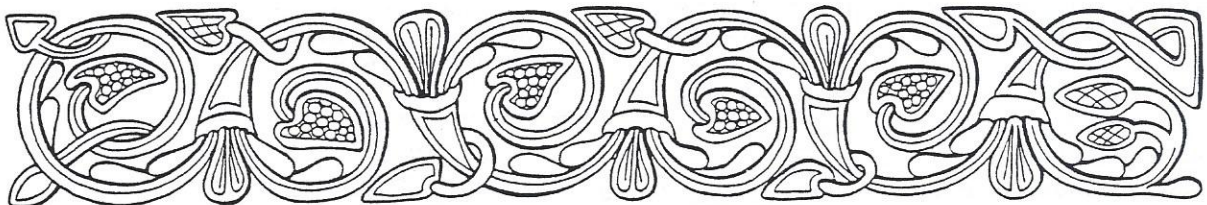
from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm. This workshop will cover (briefly) the history of dyeing, fiber types, mordanting, and techniques for dyeing small projects. In the course of the workshop, Maeve will attempt to run 4 different dye pots with at least 3 different mordants (can she do it....?). All those attending will get a sample of each dyed material so they can start a dye record-book.

Everyone with a vague interest in this craft is invited to attend, as there is the potential for much socializing while the dyes simmer!

FEE: \$1.50 per person (to cover cost of materials) You don't need to bring anything except your own lunch and drinks---Maeve's been gathering promising dye plants for weeks.

Miller in the Middle! and more!) boffer competitions, dancing lessons in the afternoon, more dancing in the evening, caroling, the ever-important Lord and Lady of Misrule, and, of course, mistletoe!

The feast will include roast beef, goose and plum pudding as well as other traditional Christmas goodies. The event will be held at the Boulder Valley Community Hall, 95th and Isabella Road, approximately fifteen minutes east of Boulder. For those of you who attended, this is the same site used for the Fourth Crown Tournament of the Outlands last year. Directions and a map will be included in next month's announcement.

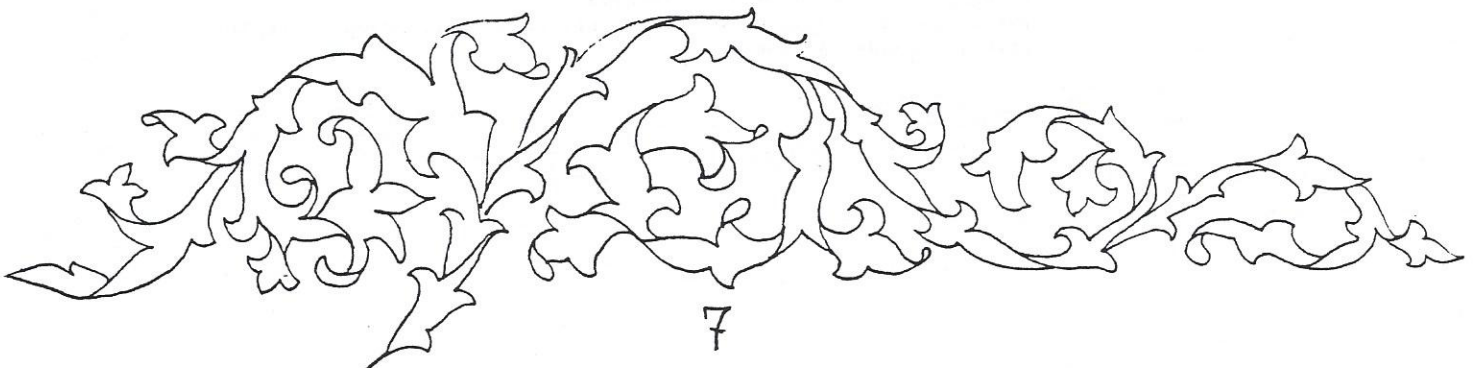

PEASANT FEAST AND REVEL

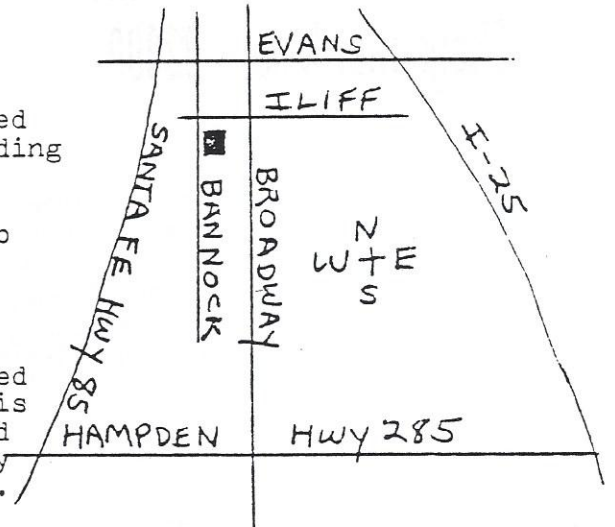

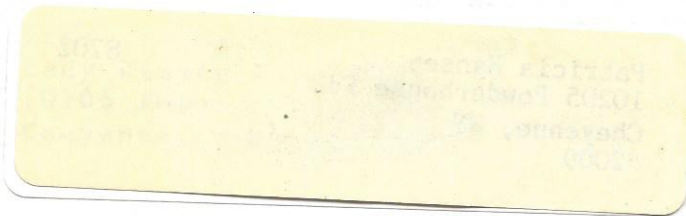

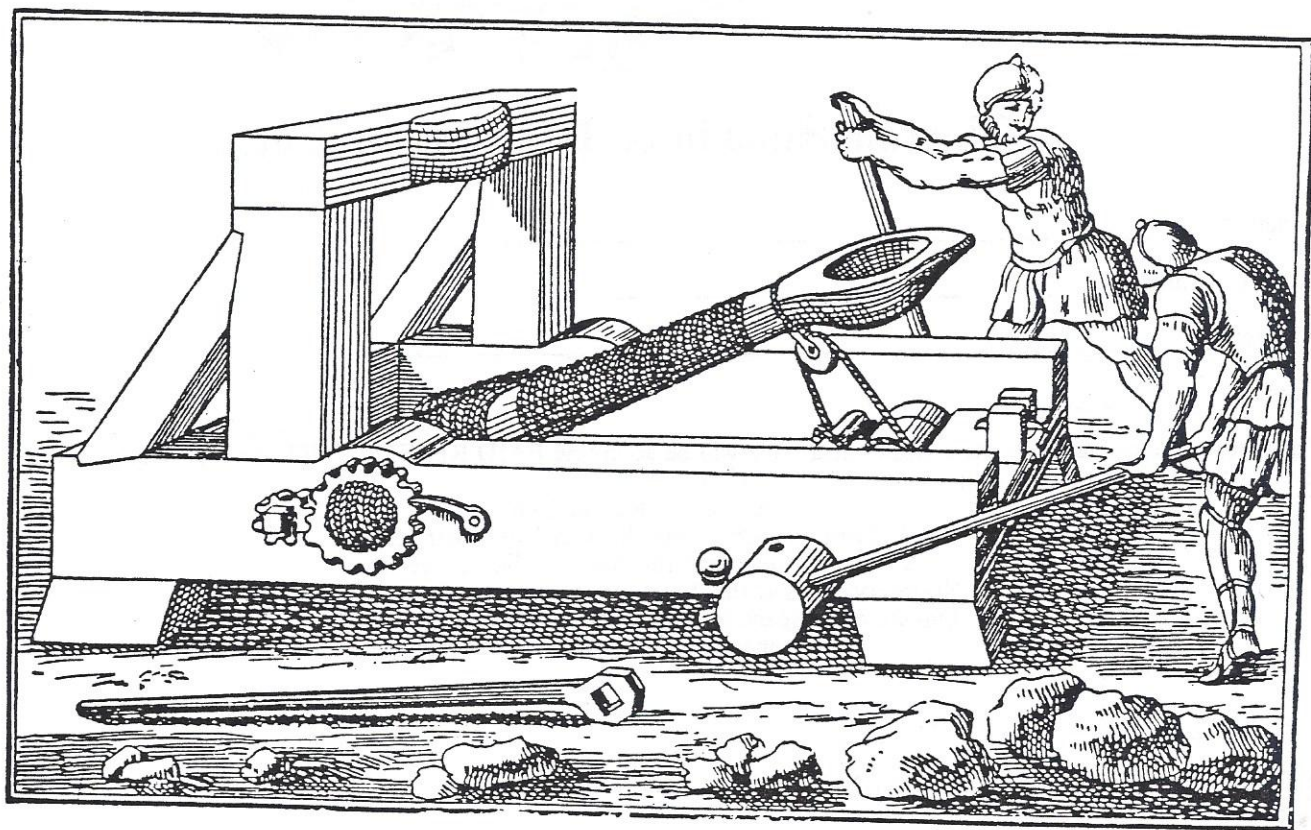
